- Continue to ensure All staff at least Level 1 trained in safeguarding
- Continue Appropriate traffic management operation procedures in place for taxi drop offs and pick ups
- Socially distanced staggered starts and finishes to continue
- Continue to ensure Appropriate Health and Safety checks undertaken
- Continue to ensure fire evacuation procedures are practised
- Continue to ensure the wellbeing of all learners is checked through PSE lessons.
- Continue to liaise with all external partners, Social services, Educational Psychologist, Local Authority Communication and Relationship Team, School Nurse
- Continue to ensure all staff are Team Teach trained.
