95% of parents that responded stated that their child likes school with 60% strongly agreeing.

This is an increase based upon last years questionnaire.

Parental Actions:

School Actions:

- Meet with parents/carers who are concerned their child does not like school, discuss possible ways in which we can support the child in school. We have a number of strategies we can use to help resolve any issues.

- Attend any meetings you are invited to.

School Actions:

- Continue to offer Autumn Term and Spring Term Parent evenings
- Full written report in the Summer Term
- Targets shared for English and Maths at parents evening in Autumn and Spring Terms
- Open door policy for parents who are concerned about progress – please contact Mrs Morgan in the school office to arrange a meeting with your child's teacher if concerned about progress.

School Actions:

- Continue to ensure appropriate number of staff are Level 3 trained in Safeguarding
- Continue to ensure All staff at least Level 1 trained in safeguarding
- Continue Appropriate traffic management operation procedures in place for taxi drop offs and pick ups
- Socially distanced staggered starts and finishes to continue
- Continue to ensure Appropriate Health and Safety checks undertaken
- Continue to ensure fire evacuation procedures are practised
- Continue to ensure the wellbeing of all learners is checked through PSE lessons.
- Continue to liaise with all external partners, Social services, Educational Phycologist , Local Authority Communication and Relationship Team , School Nurse
- Continue to ensure all staff are Team Teach trained.

5. I believe pupils behave well in school

95% of responders believe pupils behave well in school. This is an increase from 79% last year.

School Actions:

- Continue to reinforce the 3 school rules – Kind hands, Kind words and Listen and respect through assemblies and in class
- Continue to treat every pupil fairly and listen to concerns
- Continue to use appropriate consequences when needed as a result of poor behaviour choices

6. Other children do not bully my child

79% of responders agreed that other children do not bully their child – this is an increase of 11% from the last time the questionnaire was completed.

9% didn't know if their child was being bullied – this has been reduced from 18% last time.

12% believe other children bully their child. This is a slight reduction from last time.

7. I believe that if any bullying, harassment or discrimination occurs, the school deals well with it

81% agreed that the school deals well with bullying/harassment/discrimination that occurs – this is an increase of 6% from the last questionnaire.

14 % didn't know – this is a reduction from 25%

Of parents who felt they had enough information to make an informed decision 95% agreed the school deals with issues well.

Parental Actions:

- Any parent who believes their child is a victim of bullying should contact the school to discuss their concerns immediately – so the school can try and resolve the issue as soon as possible

School Actions:

- Anti-Bullying Policy on the schools website
- Any concerns that a parent has – they should come and see their child's class teacher in the first instance.
- Work with parents and children to resolve any issues of bullying as soon as possible.

8. I believe the quality of teaching is good

74% strongly agreed – this an increase from 61 % last time the questionnaire was completed.

School Actions:

- Continue to ensure all staff receive up to date training
- Develop workshops so we can share how we teach maths and literacy so parents can help at home

School Actions:

- As part of the school vision statement – ensure all children achieve their best by ensuring we have high expectations and ensure that children are appropriately challenged.
- As part of our Vision we expect all learners to give 100% in all activities. This is underpinned by the four purposes of Curriculum for Wales too.
- Through regular teacher assessment and summative assessments we are able to ensure that children's work is differentiated according to their ability and ensure that their work is challenging yet pitched at the correct level.

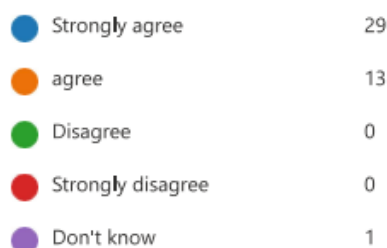
93% agreed that there are opportunities for regular exercise. This is a very slight decrease 3% from last time.

14. I believe the school helps my child to become mature and to take on responsibility

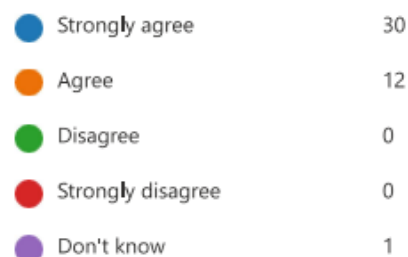


98% agree that the school helps children to become/take on responsibility

This is a 14% increase from last year.

70% strongly agree this is an increase of 22% from last year.

School Actions:

- Continue to use assessments to identify appropriate interventions to support learning

- Review interventions regularly and make sure they are fit for purpose.
- Use the Quality Teach First document to ensure we offer appropriate strategies for
